THE CHAIR'S POINT OF VIEW

Legislative Re-enactment of FEMC Top Priority

First, let me thank my fellow Board members for their confidence in selecting me as Chair for 2000. I will work hard to ensure their trust is not misplaced.

It seemed I had just been handed the gavel when I began receiving faxes and e-mails about engineer related legislation being taken up by the legislature. Several issues are extremely important to Florida registrants and I want to share them with you.

The most important bill this session is the legislation to re-enact the Florida Engineers Management Corporation. Although as of this writing it is still in proposed committee bill form in the House Committee on Business Regulation and Consumer Affairs and the Senate Regulated Industries Committee it must pass the entire legislative process by adjournment (May 5th) or FEMC will "sunset" and the administrative services important to allow the Board to function will revert to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. The Board supports the re-enactment of FEMC as we believe it has substantially improved our ability to enforce the engineer registration law and provide better protection and service to the public.

As with any major piece of legislation there may be parts not everyone is going to like. For instance, the re-enactment bill will carry a rider that will require all registrants, beginning with the renewal of licenses in 2002, to require demonstration of 15 professional development hours for each year of licensure

renewal. Not all members of the Board support mandatory continuing education but it is being pushed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation and the Florida Engineering Society. Fortunately, the current proposal allows the Board to implement the requirement so as to be consistent with NCEES guidelines so effect on licensure mobility should be minimal.

Also in the pending bill and one thing some registrants will like right away and others of us will enjoy later is a provision to set up a "Professional Engineer, Retired" status. This will allow engineers who have practiced the profession but are now fully retired to continue to be carried on the Florida roster as a Professional Engineer, Retired without payment of a fee. Heretofore, registrants had to pay the renewal fee or suffer the indignity of being shown as "delinquent" or "null and void". Hats off to former Board Chair Jim Shivler, PE, for this great idea.

Unrelated to the FEMC re-enactment but important to the effectiveness of the Board is our annual appropriations. Last year we were appropriated \$2.17 million and returned over \$500,000 to the state. For next year we requested \$2.0 million but, because we returned money last year, the Department is recommending an appropriation of \$1.67 which will not be sufficient considering our enhanced enforcement efforts and the costs associated with renewing over 26,000 licenses.

It is an interesting and perplexing budgetary conundrum as, while it is being recommended that our budget be reduced \$500,000, the Board has over \$6.0 million in reserve and, in accordance with a really good idea suggested by Governor Jeb Bush to all Boards with a positive trust account, the Board will be granting a one year "fee holiday" by reducing the biennial fee beginning Feb. 28, 2001, to \$62.50. Hopefully, we will be able to convince the legislature to authorize an adequate \$2.0 million budget.



Another bill just released in draft form will transfer the special inspector (those that are PEs) of threshold buildings to the Board from the Department of Community Affairs. That transfer, which is a good idea, carries a requirement that the minimum qualifications for the designated representative of the special inspector be an engineer intern or licensed building plans examiner, which is an idea the Board has considered as a rule but not moved on because of controversy.

Florida's legislature meets for 60 days and, as this is being written, the first week is not yet complete so there is much yet to come. The legislature has a great web site called "On Line Sunshine" at www.leg.state.fl.us.

I urge registrants to use this site to keep up with legislation relative to the engineering profession and contact your legislator and the Governor on those issues important to you.

FBPE ACTIONS IN REVIEW

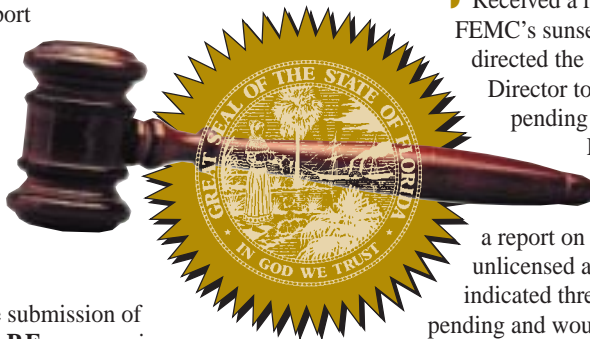
At the February 22nd and 23rd, 2000 meeting the Florida Board of Professional Engineers took action on the following issues:

- ▶ Approved 120 applications for licensure by examination;
- ▶ Denied two applications for licensure by examination;
- ▶ Approved 83 applicants for licensure by endorsement;
- ▶ Denied five applicants for licensure by endorsement;
- ▶ Approved 15 applications for the Fundamentals Exam;
- ▶ Denied 19 applications for the Fundamentals Exam;
- ▶ Conditionally approved five applications;
- ▶ Approved 11 applications pending update of experience;
- ▶ Received a report from the Probable Cause Committee that, since the October meeting of the Board, the Committee had met twice and;
 - Found probable cause in fourteen cases;
 - Found no probable cause in three cases;
 - Issued one letter of guidance;
 - Sent one case for additional review;
 - Closed one case without further prosecution.
- ▶ Elected **David Whitston, P.E.** to the Florida Engineers Management Corporation Board of Directors.
- ▶ Received a report from Executive Director **Dennis Barton** which indicated the Board would underspend its budget by approximately \$400,000 for the FY 99-00.
- ▶ Confirmed the submission of **Pedro O. Martinez, P.E.** as a nominee for an NCEES Southern Zone Award.
- ▶ Submitted the following names to NCEES for Emeritus Status: **Eugene N. Bechamps, P.E., Robert W. Day, Robert J. Dlouhy, P.E., Robert Kersten, Ph.D., P.E., Charles E. Langbein, P.E., Edward A. - ▶ Received a report from Board Counsel on the status of the following rule changes:
 - **61G15-18.011, F.A.C.**, "Definitions" has been amended to add the definition of "a registered engineer whose principal practice is civil or structural engineering" and agreed to review the effects of the rule change in June.
 - **61G15-23.002, F.A.C.**, "Seal, Signature and Date" has been amended, with additional sealing requirements for registrants.
 - **61G15-19.005** through 19.007, F.A.C., "Citations, Mediations and Non-Compliance" is being amended and clarified.
 - **61G15-32, F.A.C.**, "Responsibility Rules of Professional Engineers Concerning the Design of Fire Protection Systems" is being amended to clarify responsibilities between design engineers and fire sprinkler contractors.
 - **61G15-35, F.A.C.**, "Responsibility Rules of Professional Engineers Offering Threshold Building Inspection Services" is still in development.
 - **61G15-18.013, F.A.C.**, "Criteria for Investigators and Consultants" has been repealed.
 - **61G15-22, F.A.C.** "Continuing Education Requirements for Reactivation of Inactive License" has been revised to ease restrictions on licensees returning to active status.
- ▶ Received a report on the Florida Building Code, which in its current form does not address product approval.
- ▶ Received a report on FEMC's sunset review and directed the Executive Director to resolve as many pending issues with the DBPR as possible.
- ▶ Received a report on engineering unlicensed activity cases that indicated three cases were pending and would most likely be dismissed due to a finding that their practice was not engineering.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **Thomas Goldsbury, P.E.** who requested the Board to review procedures for engineers performing plan review and inspection services and referred the matter to the Responsibility Rules Committee.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **Beenie Bedenbaugh, P.E.** and **David Hansen, P.E.**, expressing concern about mandatory continuing education.

- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **James Tippens, P.E.** regarding a recent disciplinary case and took no action.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **Robert M. Gallen, P.E.** expressing concern about the personal data forms recently mailed to registrants.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **Marshal Thomas Ferrell, P.E.** expressing concern about the Board's impression seal requirements.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **Mark L. Jenkins, P.E.** in support of the Board's signing and sealing rules and laws.
- ▶ Reviewed an e-mail from **Mark Sinkhorn, P.E.** expressing concerns about the personal data forms.
- ▶ Reviewed correspondence from two registrants who were requesting the Board to waive continuing education requirements when activating a previously inactive license and directed Board staff to advise them of the Board's pending rule amendment requiring successful completion of the Board's Study Guide in lieu of continuing education hours.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **Thomas Sputo, Ph.D., P.E.** requesting clarification relative to sealing fabrication and erection drawings and requested **Henn Rebane, P.E.** and **Ed Bayó** to draft a response.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **M.A. Shenk, P.E.** regarding the responsibilities of an engineer of record for construction and directed Board Counsel to draft a response to Mr. Shenk regarding the engineer of record's responsibilities.
- ▶ Reviewed correspondence from **Ric Slocum, P.E.** requesting the Board to consider use of a rubber signature stamp in lieu of impression seal requirements.
- ▶ Received a report from Board Counsel advising that a legislative change would not be necessary for ship designers, as they would not be impacted by the new NCEES examination.
- ▶ Directed Executive Director Barton to draft legislation to allow a "retired P.E." status.
- ▶ Received a report on the Southern Zone Mobility point system that indicated NCEES's proposed licensure requirements are less stringent than Florida's and would require a legislative change to adopt.
- ▶ Received a report from **Henn Rebane, P.E.** that services offered by BICSI should not be considered unlicensed activity.
- ▶ Directed Board Counsel to research the issue of whether a registrant who is working on a project on federal land is required to sign and seal documents in accordance with Florida's laws and rules.
- ▶ Reviewed a letter from **C.S. Caulkin, P.E.** regarding sealing requirements for the

design of mobile home tie-downs and directed Board staff to provide a copy of this letter to Board Counsel for response.

Adopted the judge's recommendation in an exam challenge case to dismiss the candidate's petition.

Conducted one informal hearing in an exam challenge case and denied the candidate's request for additional points.

Approved Settlement Stipulations in two cases. Rejected one Stipulation and extended a counter-offer to the licensee which was accepted.

Adopted the judge's recommendation in a disciplinary case and imposed discipline on the engineer involved.

Received the Chair's appointment of several committee assignments for 2000.

Directed Board staff to issue a bulletin to all registrants after the rule definition of "public record" is revised to include record sets of plans provided to the owner.

Conducted 11 informal hearings on application denials.

Acted on 3 applications referred to the Board for personal appearance.

Acted on one request for an extension of time to comply with a Board Order.

In his capacity as a threshold inspector, it was charged that the licensee's inspections were insufficient to justify his statement that the building was being constructed in compliance with the permitted documents. In several locations where the plans specified reinforcing, the reinforcing, grout, or both had been omitted. In addition, cleanout voids at the base of block cells specified to be reinforced had been filled by others with concrete in order to give the appearance that the full cell had been filled with grout when in fact it had not.

The licensee voluntarily entered into a Stipulation with FEMC in which he neither

The licensee was charged with negligence in the practice of engineering for producing deficient contract documents. It was alleged the contract was ambiguous, failed to require a Performance Bond or a Labor and Materials Payment Bond from the Contractor, failed to require a Release of Lien from all subcontractors, and failed to document potential costs to the Owner resulting in excessive change orders.

The licensee entered into a Stipulation with FEMC for a Reprimand, payment of a \$1,000 administrative fine, and placement on probation for eighteen months with the requirement that he successfully complete a university-level course in the preparation of contract documents and specifications and a Florida specific course in contract administration.

The licensee was charged with four counts of negligence in regard to a structure he designed using structural insulated panels. He elected a formal hearing and was found guilty of negligence for deficiencies in the design and for failure to follow the manufacturer's recommendations. The Board imposed a Reprimand, a \$4,000 administrative fine, and a two-year probation with submission of a list of projects every six months for peer review.

Some FBPE Renewals to Get Discount
